

SNOW REMOVAL

POLICY No. 1

The following is a brief description of Upper Nazareth's winter road maintenance policy & activities. We ask for your cooperation so our municipality can service its residents, businesses and visitors safely and efficiently.

If a "Snow Emergency" is declared by the Chief of Police according to Ordinance No. 110, adopted February 16, 2005, you will not be allowed to park, stand or otherwise have a vehicle on the following routes:

Friedenstahl Avenue	from Tatamy Road to Route 191
Schoeneck Road	from Route 191 to Bushkill Municipal Line
Newport Avenue	from Route 191 to Tewksbury Court
Rose Inn Avenue	from Route 191 to Bushkill Municipal Line
Beil Avenue	from Rose Inn Avenue to North Broad Street
Willowdale Avenue	from Route 191 to St. Elmo Street
Sycamore Street	from St. Elmo Street to West Beil Avenue
St. Elmo Street	from Willowdale Avenue to North Broad Street

Vehicles left on these streets during a "Snow Emergency" will be towed by the Upper Nazareth Police at the owner's expense and pay a fine of \$50 to \$300 for each violation, court costs, and, if in default, up to 30 days jail time.

We have developed a snow plan which coordinates our drivers to specific areas. Our priority for addressing road clearing is as follows:

1. Emergency facilities
2. Major collector roads used as school routes
3. Developments
4. Cul-de-sac bulb clearing & intersection cleaning
5. Township owned property and sidewalks

The operation may deviate from the above priority list in case of unforeseen emergency requirements such as ambulance, fire or medical emergencies. It is our policy to clear all roads from "curb to curb" in anticipation of future storms and to provide safe traveling for the motoring public.

Citizens of Upper Nazareth Township can help this effort by removing all vehicles from the roadways (Paved Surfaces) during snow storms.

The Board of Supervisors has adopted the "Right-of-way" policies of PennDOT and neighboring municipalities. The policy addresses the placement of trees, flower gardens, fences, mailboxes, posts, etc., along the roadway. **The Township will not reimburse residents.**

or businesses for any damages to items placed in the “right-of-way” caused by snow removal. It is not the intent of any employee of Upper Nazareth to willfully cause damage to the property of its residents. Our equipment will discharge snow in driveways during the course of snow plowing.

Upper Nazareth may find it necessary to declare a “Snow Emergency” when the effects of the Weather dictate. When the Township declares a “Snow Emergency” it will be broadcast on WAEB – 790 AM, WFMZ – Channel 69, Traffax and posted on the web site ASAP.
